Recycling was very successful this year. The JR/SR doe ribbons and the wether ribbons were totally depleted after the November shows orders. A small order of wether ribbons was placed in November to make sure there was enough in stock for the first couple of months of 2018. I placed into stock the following sets of recycled ribbons:

Wethers	11
JR/SR does	55
GR does	43
JR/SR bucks	17
GR bucks	13
MC	3

This amounts to 425 individual rosettes with an approximate cost of \$1300.00. I received more ribbons for recycling this year because of the convenience of bringing them to me at convention. In addition there are still clubs that are recycling ribbons locally.

Accounting for Master Champion ribbons continues to be a bit of an issue. I am in the process of making more stringent accounting process to see if it is easier to determine where those ribbons are, and when they are and are not being used.

There was a recent issue where a wether ribbon was misprinted. It had Grand Champion Buck on it rather than Best Wether. I made the comment to the show chair that 1 out of over 10,000 ribbons I have ordered is a pretty small margin of error. She commented that the judge said that she had "seen a few already." I hope the directors and show chairmen will keep me informed. I am not too concerned if this was an isolated incident. We will certainly ask for adjustment if it is more widespread.

I will be ordering ribbons at the end of January and March as in the past. I would like to increase the order by about 10% so we do not get so close to being out by the end of the year.
